

Music and Theatre offer online and in-classroom courses that are open to all UCF students.

MUSIC ELECTIVES

The following music courses are offered in Summer A.

MUL 2010: Enjoyment of Music (3 credits, online only)

This is a class designed to help develop your understanding of musical principles and techniques for listening to music. **Fulfills GEP requirement for Cultural Foundation.

MUS 2360C: Intro to Music Technology (3 credits, online only)

This is a class aimed at the basics of music-specific technology and its application to a career in music.

The following music courses are offered in Summer B.

MUH 2017: Survey of Rock Music (3 credits, online only)

Students will learn the various influences of rock throughout the years— starting with country and R&B, the rise of teen idols through the British Invasion, and then into the late 1960s with psychedelia. Then we will conclude with the styles of Motown, Southern Rock, and Progressive Rock of the 1970s.

MUL 2010: Enjoyment of Music (3 credits)

This is a class designed to help develop your understanding of musical principles and techniques for listening to music. **Fulfills GEP requirement for Cultural Foundation.

MUT 1004: Fundamentals of Music (3 credits, online only)

You will become familiar with the terms, symbols, and common practices that provide the foundation for the musical language. This course is a prerequisite for MUT 1121: Music Theory and Musicianship I and is required for the music minor.

THEATRE ELECTIVES

THE 2000: Theatre Survey (3 credits, online only for Summer B and C)

Why will no one say the name of Shakespeare's "Scottish Play" out loud? What is the difference between farce and comedy? Why can't I take a video of the show? These and other theatrical questions will be answered in Theatre Survey. This class will increase your understanding, appreciation, and critical perceptions of theatre. The course focuses on the artistry and mechanics of producing a modern stage play by reading scripts in class and attending live theatre performances at Theatre UCF.

THE 3250: Sex, Drugs & Rock n' Roll Musicals (3 credits, online only for Summer B)

Explore themes like sexual awakening, drug use, religion, political struggles, and freedom of expression through classic Rock & Roll shows like *Hair*, *Tommy*, and *Jesus Christ Superstar* and shows that speak for the new generation, like *Rent*, *Spring Awakening*, and *American Idiot*.
